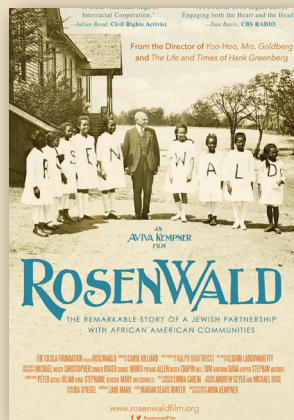

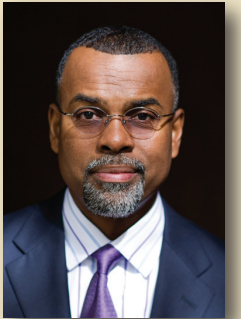
**MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. LECTURE AND CONVERSATION SERIES**

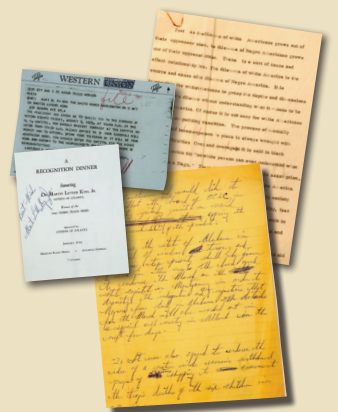
